



# YOUR VOTING RIGHTS IN WASHINGTON

## Election Day: Tuesday, November 6, 2018

#### Who Can Vote?

- In order to vote, you must register first.
- The deadline to register by mail or online is Monday, October 8, 2018.
- The deadline to register in-person for new Washington State voters is October 29, 2018.
- To register to vote:
  - o You must live in Washington, be a U.S. citizen, and be age 18 or older on Election Day;
  - O You must not be disqualified from voting due to a court order; and
  - o You must not be under Department of Corrections supervision for a Washington felony conviction.

#### When do I vote?

• Washington conducts elections by mail. After you register, the ballot is mailed to your home. The 18-day voting period begins on October 19, 2018 and ends at 8:00 p.m. on November 6, 2018.

## Will I need to bring identification?

• Since Washington conducts elections by mail, in most cases Washington voters are not required to show identification (ID) when voting. Voters are required to sign a declaration with their mail-in ballots.

#### Can I receive assistance in Spanish?

- If you live in these counties, you are entitled to a Spanish language ballot and assistance in Spanish: Adams, Franklin, and Yakima.

## Can I vote by mail?

• Yes. All voters can use a vote-by-mail ballot.

## What if my name is not on the list of voters?

• If your name is not on the list, or there is a problem with your ID, you have the right to vote on a provisional ballot. Be sure to ask for a provisional ballot if there is a problem at the vote center.
