Re: Request for State Investigation of the May 1, 2007 Incident

Dear Attorney General Brown,

On behalf of the Mexican American Legal Defense and Educational Fund, I write to urge you to conduct a prompt and full investigation of the May 1, 2007 incident at MacArthur Park in Los Angeles. MALDEF shares the community's outrage concerning the events that transpired on May 1, 2007 involving the Los Angeles Police Department's use of excessive force against families and members of the media who gathered peacefully at the park.

Los Angeles Chief of Police Bratton has promised to conduct his own investigation, and that is a much needed first step. However, there is also a need for the community to have an independent review of this matter by the State Attorney General's office. A local investigation alone is not enough because the victims of the May 1st incident may be hesitant to speak freely to agents of the LAPD. This barrier would be minimized if the state conducts its own independent review.

A state investigation is also necessary given what transpired on May 1<sup>st</sup> was a generalized attack on the community as a whole. As you are probably aware, there are prior incidents of strained relationships between the LAPD and the community arising out of allegations of excessive use of force, such as the Rodney King incident and the killing of KMEX and LA Times Reporter Ruben Salazar.

These unfortunate events make it crucial to have the state conduct its own investigation in order to give credence to any ultimate findings that are made. A state investigation will have the critical independence to be meaningful and to help heal the damage caused by Tuesday's actions.
