



YOUR VOTING RIGHTS IN ARIZONA Election Day: Tuesday, November 3, 2020

Who can vote?

- In order to vote in the election on November 3, you must be registered to vote. If you are not already registered to vote, the deadline for voter registration **online**, **by mail**, **or in-person was October 15**. You can find out if you are registered or if your voter info is current here: https://my.arizona.vote/WhereToVote.aspx?s=individual&Language=en.
- To register to vote:
 - O You must live in Arizona, be a U.S. citizen, and be age 18 or older on Election Day;
 - You must also not have been convicted of a felony without having had your civil rights restored.

Can I vote by mail?

- Any registered voter may vote by mail instead of going to the polls on Election Day.
- You can request a ballot-by-mail online, by email, by mail, or by telephone: https://azsos.gov/votebymail.
 - o Request your ballot-by mail as early as possible. Counties begin mailing ballots on October 7.
 - O Your request for a mail ballot must arrive by 5 p.m. on October 23.
- To vote your completed ballot-by-mail, you can mail back your ballot or drop it off at any ballot drop-box, drop-off location, early voting location, or Election Day voting location in your county on or before Election Day.
 - o If you decide to mail your ballot, put your completed ballot in the mail no later than October 27.

How do I vote in person?

- Early Voting: In-person early voting begins in all Arizona counties on October 7 and continues until 5:00 p.m. on the Friday before Election Day. For early voting in person, you do not need a ballot-by-mail.

- On Election Day, vote at your polling place, found here: https://my.arizona.vote/WhereToVote.aspx?s=address.
- **Identification** (ID) is **required** for voting in-person early and on Election Day. **If you don't have a photo ID**, **you may still vote** with other forms of ID listed here: https://azsos.gov/elections/voting-election.

Can I bring someone to help me vote?

• Yes. If you need help reading in English or help voting, you can bring a person into the voting booth to help you vote. You can bring any person except your employer, an agent of your employer, your union representative, or a candidate running in the election. The person you bring does not need to be a registered voter.

Can I receive assistance in Spanish?

• Yes. You are entitled to a Spanish language ballot and assistance in Spanish in the following counties: Maricopa, Pima, Santa Cruz, and Yuma.

What if my name is not on the list of voters?

• If your name is not on the list, or there is a problem with your ID, you have the right to vote on a provisional ballot. Be sure to ask for a provisional ballot if you do not receive a regular ballot.
