



YOUR VOTING RIGHTS IN COLORADO

Election Day: Tuesday, November 3, 2020

Who can vote?

- In order to vote in the election on November 3, you must be registered to vote. If you are not already registered to vote, you can register in person even on Election Day. You can find out if you are registered here: <https://www.sos.state.co.us/voter/pages/pub/olvr/findVoterReg.xhtml>.
- If you registered to vote before October 27, you will receive a mail ballot. After October 27 you can pick up a mail ballot at a Voter Service and Polling Center.
- You can register to vote online or in person through Election Day. You can register online here: <https://www.sos.state.co.us/voter/pages/pub/olvr/verifyNewVoter.xhtml>.
- To register in person, you can visit a polling location in your county through Election Day. Learn more at: <http://www.sos.state.co.us/pubs/elections/FAQs/VoterRegistrationFAQ.html>.
- To register to vote:
 - You must live in Colorado, be a U.S. citizen, and be age 18 or older on Election Day.
 - You must also not be serving a sentence for a felony; people on parole can vote.

When do I vote?

- Early voting begins October 19. Early voting locations are open 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.
- On Election Day, Tuesday, November 3, the polls are open 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.

Can I vote by mail?

- Yes, all voters in Colorado are sent mail ballots and can vote by mail if they choose not to vote in person.
- If this is your first time voting by mail, you may need to provide a copy of your ID. You can find acceptable forms of ID here: www.sos.state.co.us/pubs/elections/vote/acceptableFormsOfID.html.
- No later than 7 p.m. on Election Day, your mail ballot must either be *received* in the mail by the county clerk or dropped off at one of the locations listed here: www.sos.state.co.us/pubs/elections/Resources/CountyElectionOffices.html.

Where do I vote in person?

How do I vote in person?

- All voters who want to vote in person must provide ID, such as a utility bill with the voter's name and address. The address on your ID does not have to match your voter registration but does have to show a Colorado address.

Can I bring someone to help me vote?

- Yes. If you have a disability or need help reading in English, you can bring a person into the voting booth to help you vote. You can bring any person except your employer or your union representative.

Can I receive assistance in Spanish?

- Yes. In Colorado, you are entitled to bilingual voting materials and assistance in Spanish if you vote in Conejos, Costilla, Denver, and Saguache counties.

What if my name is not on the list of voters?

- If your name is not on the list, or there is a problem with your ID, you have the right to vote on a provisional ballot. Be sure to ask for a provisional ballot if you are not given a regular ballot.
