



YOUR VOTING RIGHTS IN GEORGIA **Election Day: Tuesday, November 3, 2020**

Who Can Vote?

- In order to vote in the election on November 3, you must be registered to vote. The deadline to register to vote was October 5. You can find out if you are registered here:

- To register to vote:
 - You must live in Georgia, live in the county in which you want to vote, be a U.S. citizen, and be age 18 or older on Election Day. You also must not be serving a sentence (including probation or parole) for a conviction of a felony involving moral turpitude.

Can I vote by mail?

- Yes, any Georgia voter may vote by mail. Your mail ballot request must be received by election officials by October 30.
- You can request an absentee ballot in writing, in person, or by email, using this form:

- If you want to vote by mail, submit your mail ballot application as early as possible.

How do I vote in person?

- You can **vote early between October 12 and October 30**, which includes early voting on Saturday, October 24. The list of early voting locations and their hours is posted here:

- On Election Day, **Tuesday, November 3**, the polls are open 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.

- If you have a valid identification card, you must show it to vote at the polls. Acceptable photo IDs are:
 - Georgia driver's license (even if expired); a state or federal government-issued ID; a Georgia public college or university student ID; a U.S. passport; a U.S. military ID; a valid tribal ID; or any type of government employee ID.
- If you do not have a form of ID listed above, you may obtain a free ID from any county registrar office or the Department of Drivers Services. For more information visit:

- If you don't have a photo ID on Election Day, you can still vote by provisional ballot, but must present an above-listed ID within three days.

Can I bring someone to help me vote?

- Yes. If you need help reading in English, you can bring a person into the voting booth to help you vote. You can bring any person that you want except your employer or your union representative. The person you bring does not need to be a registered voter.

Can I receive assistance in Spanish?

- If you reside in Gwinnett County, you have the right to receive assistance in Spanish.

What if my name is not on the list of voters?

- If your name is not on the list, or there is a problem with your ID, you have the right to vote on a provisional ballot. Be sure to ask for a provisional ballot if you do not receive a regular ballot.
