



## YOUR VOTING RIGHTS IN MICHIGAN

Election Day: **Tuesday, November 3, 2020**

Polls Will Be Open 7 A.M. to 8 P.M.



### **Who Can Vote?**

- You can vote if you are a U.S. citizen, are at least 18 years old on Election Day, and are not serving a sentence in jail or prison.
- You can register in person at your city or township clerk's office **on or before November 3**.
- The deadline to register by mail or online is October 19.

### **Can I vote by mail?**

- **Yes.** Registered voters can vote by mail OR vote in person.
- If you wish to vote by mail, apply at: <https://mvic.sos.state.mi.us/Home/VoteAtHome>.
- Your vote-by-mail application must be received by the election office by **October 30**.
- To be counted, your voted ballot must be returned and received by **8 p.m. on November 3**.

### **When and where do I vote in person?**

- The polls are open 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. on **November 3**.

### **Do I need to show ID to vote on Election Day?**

- You can show picture ID or sign a statement affirming that you do not have ID with you.
- The election officials at the poll will accept a driver's license, government ID card, U.S. passport, military ID, high school or college photo ID, or tribal photo ID.

### **Can I bring someone to help me vote?**

- **Yes.** If you need help reading or understanding English, you can bring a person of any age to help you vote. You can bring any person that you want except your employer or your union representative.

### **Can I receive assistance in Spanish?**

- You have the right to a Spanish ballot and help in Spanish if you live in **Colfax Township** or the **City of Fennville**.

### **What if my name is not on the list of voters?**

- If your name is not on the list or your right to vote is challenged, you have the right to vote using a provisional ballot. Ask for a provisional ballot if you do not receive a regular ballot.
