

YOUR VOTING RIGHTS IN OHIO

Election Day: **Tuesday, November 3, 2020** Polls Will Be Open 6:30 A.M. to 7:30 P.M. Apply to Vote-by-Mail Early, No Later Than **October 31**



Who Can Vote?

- You can vote if you are a U.S. Citizen, are at least 18 years old on Election Day, have lived at your address for at least 30 days before the election, and are not serving a sentence in jail or prison.
- The deadline to register to vote is **October 5.**

- You can register online if you have an Ohio driver's license or State ID at: <u>https://olvr.ohiosos.gov/</u>.

Can I vote-by-mail?

- Yes. Registered voters can vote-by-mail OR vote-in-person. If you wish to vote-by-mail, apply at: <u>https://www.sos.state.oh.us/elections/voters/absentee-ballot</u>.
- If you wish to vote-by-mail, apply right away. To be counted, your voted mail ballot must be postmarked by **November 2** or delivered in-person to your county board of elections by **7:30 pm on November 3, Election Day**.

When and where do I vote in person?

- Early in-person voting at your county election office begins on **October 6**.
- The polls are open 6:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. on Tuesday, November 3, Election Day.

Do I need to show ID to vote on Election Day?

• Yes. You must show ID when voting on Election Day. You may show any one of the following: an unexpired Ohio driver's license or State ID card; a military ID; or a current (within the last 12 months) utility bill; bank statement; government check; paycheck; or government document that shows your name and current address.

Can I bring someone to help me vote?

• Yes. If you need help reading or understanding English, you can bring a person of any age to help you vote. You can bring any person that you want except your employer or your union representative.

What if my name is not on the list of voters?

• If your name is not on the list or your right to vote is challenged, you have the right to vote using a provisional ballot. Ask for a provisional ballot if you do not receive a regular ballot.
