



## **YOUR VOTING RIGHTS IN OHIO**

Election Day: **Tuesday, November 3, 2020**

Polls Will Be Open 6:30 A.M. to 7:30 P.M.

Apply to Vote-by-Mail Early, No Later Than **October 31**



### **Who Can Vote?**

- You can vote if you are a U.S. Citizen, are at least 18 years old on Election Day, have lived at your address for at least 30 days before the election, and are not serving a sentence in jail or prison.
- The deadline to register to vote is **October 5**.

- You can register online if you have an Ohio driver's license or State ID at: <https://olvr.ohiosos.gov/>.
- Voter registration information is available at: <https://www.sos.state.oh.us/elections/voters/register>.

### **Can I vote-by-mail?**

- Yes. Registered voters can vote-by-mail OR vote-in-person. If you wish to vote-by-mail, apply at: <https://www.sos.state.oh.us/elections/voters/absentee-ballot>.
- If you wish to vote-by-mail, apply right away. To be counted, your voted mail ballot must be postmarked by **November 2** or delivered in-person to your county board of elections by **7:30 pm on November 3, Election Day**.

### **When and where do I vote in person?**

- Early in-person voting at your county election office begins on **October 6**.
- The polls are open **6:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m.** on **Tuesday, November 3**, Election Day.

### **Do I need to show ID to vote on Election Day?**

- Yes. You must show ID when voting on Election Day. You may show any one of the following: an unexpired Ohio driver's license or State ID card; a military ID; or a current (within the last 12 months) utility bill; bank statement; government check; paycheck; or government document that shows your name and current address.

### **Can I bring someone to help me vote?**

- Yes. If you need help reading or understanding English, you can bring a person of any age to help you vote. You can bring any person that you want except your employer or your union representative.

### **What if my name is not on the list of voters?**

- If your name is not on the list or your right to vote is challenged, you have the right to vote using a provisional ballot. Ask for a provisional ballot if you do not receive a regular ballot.
