



YOUR VOTING RIGHTS IN UTAH Election Day: Tuesday, November 3, 2020

Who can vote?

- In order to vote in the election on November 3, you must be registered to vote. You can register up to and on Election Day. You can find out if you are registered by visiting: <u>https://votesearch.utah.gov/voter-search/search/search-by-voter/voter-info</u>.
- You can register by mail or online by 5 p.m. on October 23. If you register online, you need a valid Utah driver license or state ID and the address listed on your ID must match your current address.

- You can register in-person during the early voting period or on Election Day at a polling location; if you register at a polling place you will cast a provisional ballot.
- To register to vote:
 - You must live in Utah, be a U.S. citizen, and be age 18 or older on Election Day.
 - You must have been a resident of Utah for at least the 30 days immediately before the election.
 - \circ You must also not be serving a sentence for a felony conviction.

When do I vote?

- In-person early voting begins on October 20, 2020 and ends on October 30, 2020.
- Election Day is Tuesday, November 3, 2020. The polls are open 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.
- If you vote by mail, complete and postmark your ballot by November 2 or drop it off at your county clerk's office on Election Day.

Where do I vote?

- All active registered voters in Utah will receive a ballot by mail and can vote by mail.
- You may vote early in-person at your county clerk's office. Some counties offer multiple locations for early voting. To find early voting polling locations or your assigned Election Day polling location visit: https://votesearch.utah.gov/voter-search/search-by-address/how-and-where-can-i-vote.
- To find your assigned Election Day polling location, you can also check your voter card.

How do I vote in person?

• At the polls, you must present an unexpired photo ID <u>or</u> two other documents with your name and *current* address. To check the list of acceptable forms of ID, visit: <u>https://voteinfo.utah.gov/voter-id-requirements/</u>.

Can I bring someone to help me vote?

• Yes. If you need help reading in English or you have a disability, you can bring a person into the voting booth to help you vote. You can bring any person except your employer, a trade union representative, or a candidate running in the election. The person you bring does not need to be a registered voter.

Can I receive assistance in Spanish?

• If you live in Salt Lake County, you can request a Spanish mail ballot and can access a Spanish ballot on the voting machines if you vote in person.

What if my name is not on the list of voters?

• If your name is not on the list, you have the right to cast a provisional ballot. To cast a provisional ballot, you must provide a valid voter ID and proof of residence. If you do not receive a regular ballot, ask for a provisional ballot.
